
# **Principal's Message**

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# Empathy

## Whats New in K-2

Our current book in K2 is "The Mess We Made" by Michelle Lord. It is a beautiful picture book that explores the environmental impact of trash and plastic in the ocean and marine life, and it inspires kids to do their part to combat pollution. We have been using the tier two and three words from the story to inspire our writing. Year Two have been learning about cause and effect. They've written some great compound sentences describing lots of cause and effects.

In science we investigated light, where it comes from and how it can only travel in a straight line. We experimented on a variety of objects to see if light could travel through them and if it changed when it did. Our blue light torches were very handy and made some very pretty patterns when shone through a bottle of water.

# Whats happening in Yr 3/4

The students are enjoying gymnastics for sport on Friday mornings and this week they started skipping for fitness.

Mrs Forsyth has continued with their work on Information Reports and soon the students will be able to create their own without assistance. Quick Writes and Free Writes are now going to be done on their laptops in preparation for the future when all their writing and research will be required to be submitted online. Please encourage your children to practise Typing.com at home or just using the computer to create stories. We learnt another form of figurative language this week and that was "Onomatopoeia". These are words that suggest the sound of what is being described e.g., "Bang", "Hiss", "Moo". The children enjoyed role playing scenarios for people to guess the correct sound word.

Year 3/4 are studying a book called "A Different Dog" with Mrs Forsyth and we have begun reading "Storm Boy" as well. The children have been connecting well with themes in these books, due to their own experiences. Maths has been a revision of addition and subtraction strategies and in measurement we looked at converting different units of measure.

The students are reminded of the importance of reading each night to develop their vocabulary and spelling as exposure to a variety of words and sentences is essential.

# Whats new in Yr 5/6

This week in 5/6, we have been continuing our learning of science fiction narratives. In reading, we have compared two of our texts and some short films to define what makes a great science fiction plot, character, and setting. We have also investigated the themes and society issues that are covered in the stories. Students worked together to plan and write a science fiction narrative about an exciting dystopian future world that has been overrun by robots. We are looking forward to sharing it with you soon. In maths, we had a look at our check-in assessment and NAPLAN results to make learning goals. Our first goal was time elapsed and time, presented in word problems. We learnt two strategies to calculate time elapsed and really enjoyed learning how times zones work.

In Science we investigated the word 'viscous' and conducted experiments to test the viscosity of liquids. We had a lot of messy fun. Students also enjoyed making baking soda and vinegar volcanos.
