Welcome to the end of week six term four. Only four weeks to go until the students are finished for the year.

On Thursday I attended the Principals Network Meeting in Moree. We had a range of professional learning ranging from The New Curriculum, teaching fluency in reading and the School Plan. It is great to be able to keep abreast of initiatives in step with our city counter parts. Next year the new English and Maths Curriculum for Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two will roll out statewide. We are fortunate to have been one of the 500 schools that engaged in early implementation in 2022 so our staff are well prepared for the change. The New South Wales Department of Education has taken the Curriculum developed by the New South Wales Education Standards Authority NESA and created a scope and sequence and written units for teachers to implement. This will ensure consistency of delivery across the state.

I had the honour of handing out the Macintyre Young Writers Awards this morning.



We had some awesome news this week concerning the results of the State relay event held earlier in the term.

Our small schools relay team was awarded a bronze medal from the NSW State PSSA Athletics Carnival. Apparently, one of the teams who had placed in the Norm and Elizabeth Austin Relay had been accidentally entered into the wrong division. To be eligible to compete in this relay your school must have an enrolment of less than twenty-six in February of the year of competition, when school enrolments are officially recorded.
