

### Whats New in K-2

Another fantastic week in K2. We have been making art works using wax crayon and colour washes.

Homework is coming home on Tuesdays and returned the following Monday.

We have been reading 'A Bird and a Bag' by Pamela Alen to learn about narrative writing and telling stories. Kindy have started reading their very first books and are excited to keep learning their sounds.

In Mathematics we have been learning our 2D shapes and what attributes make them similar and different. Year 1 have learnt about trapeziums and that they have attributes that are similar to a rectangle and a triangle at the same time. We have all enjoyed playing the 'Attribute Train Game' and learning about patterns along with our shapes. We even added some music into our lesson on patterns and used our new percussion instruments to create some ABB and AAB patterns to play.

#### Whats new in Yr 3-4

We have been working very hard this week to fit our timetabled learning in.

The children realised it was our first Monday in the classroom this year. The first Monday was a pupil free day and on the second Monday, the Macintyre swimming carnival was held.

We started our grammar lessons talking about common nouns. In spelling we are reviewing our long vowel sounds and we have used our handwriting books for the first time. Reading is a very important skill to learn as it is the basis of our learning at school and in the greater community, understanding what we read is vital.

Years 3/4 have been focusing on a daily lesson of reading comprehension. One of our readings was an informative text about Bamboo. Did you know that in some countries they make bicycle frames out of Bamboo. You may even have a shirt or a set of sheets made from Bamboo.

The students are working on a story called "Imagine" where they are given five characters to choose from and they must write their story around the chosen character. There were five objects to choose from as well. I am looking forward to reading their stories.

Today, Mrs Forsyth has started working with Year 3/4, on activities which will be used in our school show display. I believe they are doing a research activity, please ask your children what interesting facts they have discovered today.

### Whats new in Yr 5/6

It has been a big week for sport! Year 5 and 6 children have competed in swimming, touch, tennis and oz-tag. Congratulations to the children for striving to do their best in the sports they chose.

On Tuesday, I pointed out to the class how cooperative and kind they are to each other. At break times, they have been enjoying creating a dance together and some conversations in class were about swapping and lending each other good books to read. We are lucky to have such good role models in our seniors.

Homework started this week! We talked about homework being a consolidation of learning from school and a way to build good study habits. Not a stressful time.

I was glad to hear from the children that they were enjoying reading "Growing Up with a Bucket Full of Happiness". This will give the children a greater understanding of ideas covered in our 'Resilience Project' sessions with Mrs Sloan.

NAPLAN practise is in full swing and we're making it as fun as possible while keeping in mind that it is an important assessment, and we need to all try our best. Year 6 is off the hook this year but it is good practice to be familiar with the type of questions in the tests.

While reading our class novel "Wonder", August is teaching us some wonderful life lessons in empathy and tolerance. Although this week's reading was a bit of a tearjerker. We are looking forward to some parents joining us for assembly on Friday afternoon.

Nine students from North Star attended the Moree Zone Swimming Carnival known as the McKechnie Shield which was held in Narrabri on Wednesday 22 February 2023.


